



St. Andrew's CE Primary-Pupil Premium Report 2016-17

Context

This report with outline the impact Pupil Premium spending in our school this year. This is funding allocated to the school and is based on the number of pupils who have been eligible for Free School Meals in the last six years, or who are looked after by the Local Authority.

The Pupil Premium money which St. Andrew's receives in our school budget is used to make a contribution to the cost of a range of intervention and support programmes. This targeted support ensures that all of our children are supported in their learning so that they can make the best possible progress. We identify areas of need for particular children through careful data analysis and discussion with staff, parents and children. We then plan the best intervention strategies to address these needs and track the children's progress through discussions with class teachers at half termly Pupil Progress meetings; this enables us to measure the impact of any additional funding we receive.

Analysis of pupil needs end July 2016

At the end of the previous academic year the following analysis was used to inform the spending plan.

- **Maths:**

Whilst progress for PP pupils remains good, due to targeted intervention and very good teaching, 60% of PP children are below ARE (Age Related Expectations)

Reading:

Progress slightly below other pupils. 20% below ARE

- **Writing:**

Progress slightly above most other pupils -however 20% below ARE

This data is based on extremely low numbers of pupils and so it is very difficult to identify trends across the school. However, significantly 60% of the Pupil Premium children were to be in the same class and so this fact influenced the way we used funding.

Barriers to learning for pupils eligible for pupil premium funding

The majority of children who receive the pupil premium grant at St Andrew's do not have specific learning difficulties our challenge is to provide enrichment and curriculum enhancement. However, some pupils may not be at that expected standard for their age which may impact on their ability to access the curriculum effectively. Other barriers for our pupils may include financial constraints in accessing a wide range of cultural experiences. We are also keen to monitor pupil well-being and ensure that emotional support is provided if needed as we are aware that emotional difficulties can impact on a child's academic progress.
